Enterprise
Champions
(Students)**

Students will submit an application which illustrates both their leadership and enterprising attributes across a range or enterprising activities. This will reinforce the understanding of what sets enterprising people apart.

Students should provide specific examples and the context of enterprising attributes they believe they have developed, rather than merely providing a list of activities in which they have participated. For example, a student might identify “resilience” as an attribute they gained when an initial approach to a project failed and rather than give up, they sought and followed an alternative action to achieve their goal. We ask schools to encourage students to self-nominate in this category. All applications will be verified by the Principal, and no limit will be placed on the number of nominations from any one school.
